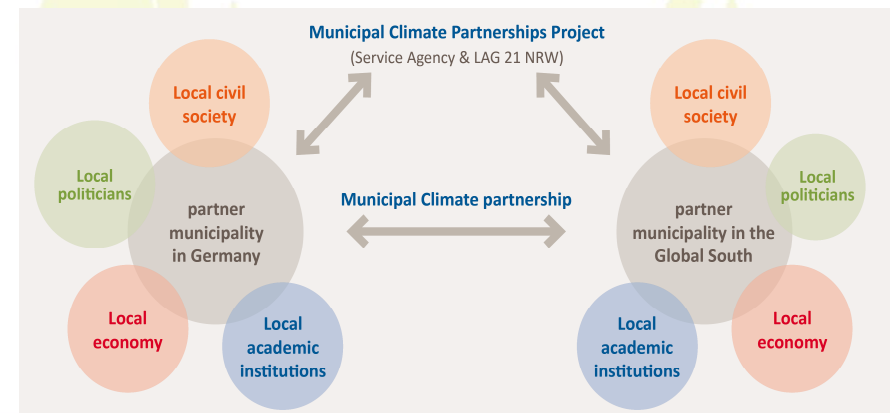

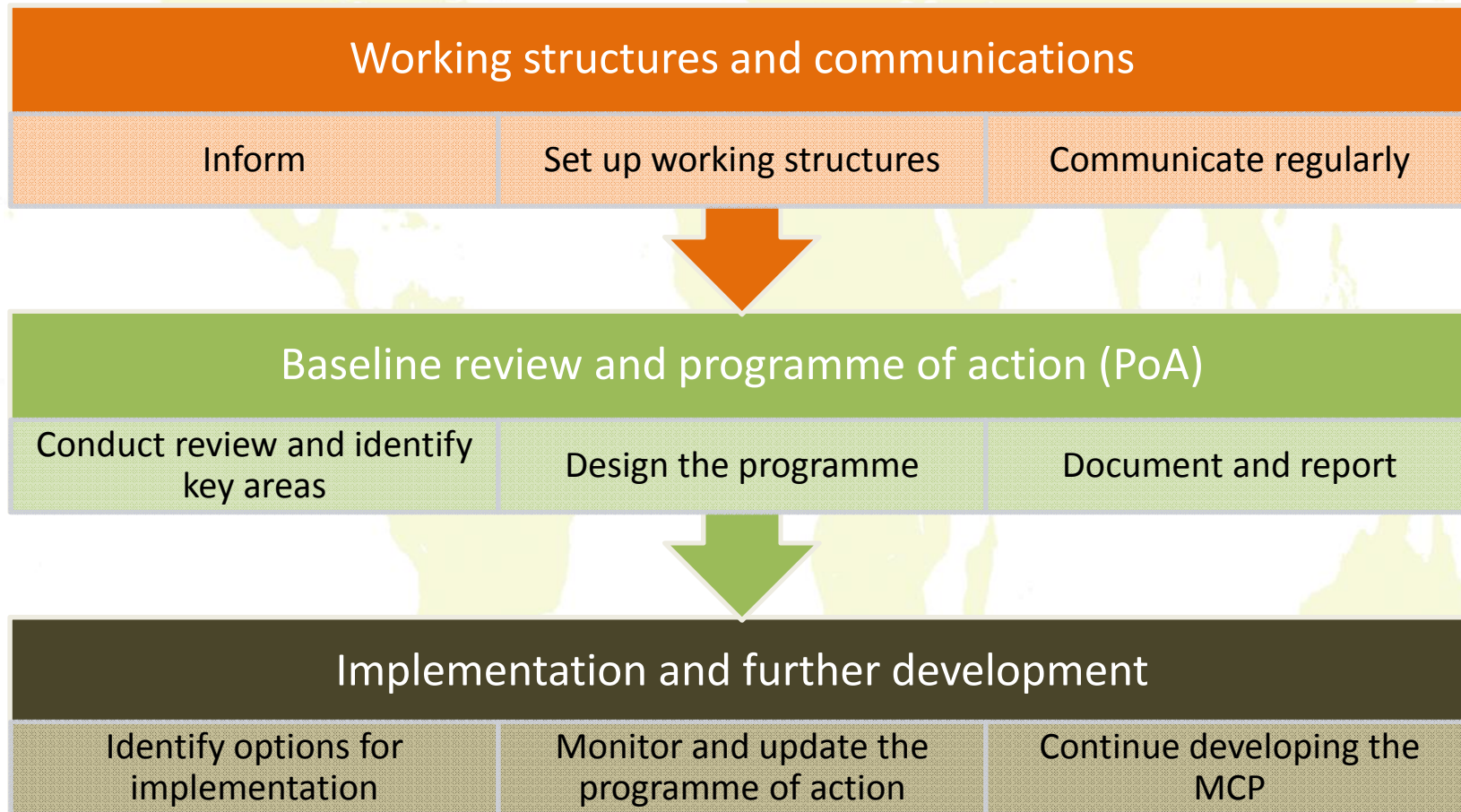

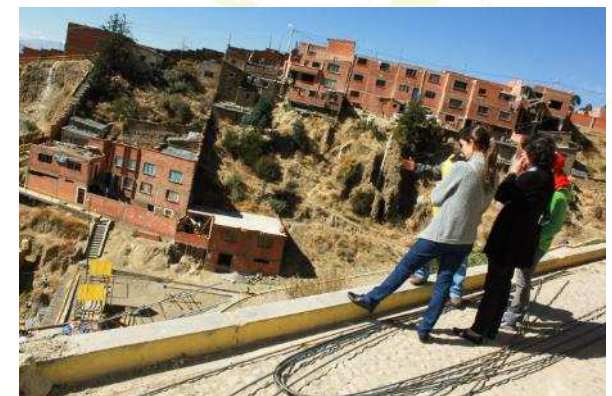
Municipal Climate Partnerships - worldwide
